## **IMPORTANT SAFETY RECALL NOTICE**

February 21, 2020

To: Owners of ECHO PB-8010H and PB-8010T Backpack Blowers

In cooperation with the U.S. Consumer Product Safety Commission, ECHO Incorporated is recalling certain ECHO backpack blowers and replacement shoulder straps. These products and straps were sold between August 2018 and February 2020 throughout the United States and Canada by independent ECHO dealers and online at www.homedepot.com and www.grainger.com.

**The Problem:** Shoulder straps, plastic buckles, or the anti-static wire can be drawn into the fan causing the fan to break apart and allow plastic pieces to be expelled through the blower fan housing and pose a laceration and impact hazard to the operator. The expelled plastic pieces also can cause injury to bystanders.

Our records indicate that you may have purchased a product subject to this recall. You should discontinue use of this product immediately and contact your local authorized ECHO service dealer for free repair of your blower. ECHO PB-8010H and PB-8010T Backpack Blowers and Replacement Shoulder Straps Sold from August 2018 through February 2020


The conditions listed below can result in damage to the blower fan and fan housing causing plastic pieces to be expelled from the machine. Blower fan failure can result in lacerations and impact hazards to the operator. The expelled plastic pieces also can cause injury to bystanders.

- Shoulder strap upper stitching may come loose from harness allowing plastic buckles to become detached and become drawn into the blower fan.
- Shoulder adjustment straps can become drawn into the blower fan.
- Improper routing of the anti-static discharge ground wire can allow the wire to be drawn into the blower fan.



If your PB-8010H or PB-8010T Backpack Blower or replacement shoulder strap is within the recall serial number range, or the dates listed above, **you should discontinue use of this product immediately** and contact your local authorized ECHO service dealer for free repair of your blower.
